




Review

Your proposal is evaluated by a Review Committee.

Feedback is provided to you if your proposal doesn't advance.







Public engagement

During public engagement, you can provide feedback on regulation change proposals through a survey or at a community meeting.

Public feedback is captured in a "What we Heard" report and published online.



The Board makes a set of recommendations to the Minister of Environment based on conservation considerations, public feedback and local, traditional and scientific knowledge.



The Government of Yukon consults with affected Indigenous governments and groups, and the Yukon Fish and Wildlife Management Board. The Board then provides its final views.



Implementation

New regulations are drafted and become law.

Regulatory changes are published in the annual hunting, fishing or trapping summaries.



The Government of Yukon makes a final decision based on all feedback.
