The A.J. Goddard was a gold rush era sternwheeler that took miners and supplies from Lake Bennet to the head of the Whitehorse rapids. The vessel sank in October 1901 during a storm on Lake Laberge. The whereabouts of the wreckage were unknown until 2008, when it was discovered at Goddard Point.
